Behaviour consultation package -What's included?

Behaviour Consultation Up to 2.5 hours

This is held at your home or remotely (e.g. over zoom). During the behaviour consultation, I ask lots of questions regarding your dog, their history, background and behaviour. I then discuss the diagnosis of the behaviour, including what I think has caused the behaviour to develop. We then discuss strategies to help manage the behaviour, including any safety concerns.

Behaviour Report

You will then be sent a tailered behaviour report both through the post and over email detailing all we discussed during the consultation. This includes the behaviour diagnosis, causes, safety risks, and strategies to manage the behaviour.

This will accompany any additional training materials and information in a supplementary pack.

A copy of the report will also be sent to your referring vet, along with any necessary communications to discuss medical aspects of the case.

Follow-up Appointment

1-hour

Depending on the nature of your dog's behaviour problems, this will either be held at your home, in a park, field, secure dog field or remotely. During the follow-up session, we discuss progress, any questions or concerns you may have, and we will discuss (and maybe practise) any necessary behaviour modification training.

After this, additional follow-up appointments can be booked for an additional £40/session

You will also be provided with remote support in the form of email, phone calls or text for up to 3 months after the consultation.

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How to book a consultation

Step 1: Get in touch

Not sure if a behaviour consultation is right for you? Give me a free non-obligatory call, email or message to discuss your questions and to see if a behaviour consultation is what you need.

Step 2: Veterinary Referral

Before a consultation can be booked, I require a signed referral form from your vet. The referral form will be provided to you to give to your vet to sign. Your vet may first want to check your dog over for any signs of pain or medical issues that could be affecting the behaviour.

Why is this important?

Many behaviour problems are caused or affected by pain or medical issues. These issues may not be obvious, so it's important your vet rules this out first.

Step 3: Choose a date and time

Once a signed vet referral form has been received from you or your vet, you will then be sent a list of dates and times to choose for the behaviour consultation appointment.

Step 4: Payment

Either full payment or a 50% deposit is required for the booking to be secured. Please note: The 50% deposit (or 50% of the full payment made) will not be refundable if you decide to cancel your booking within 5 days of the arranged consultation date.

DID YOU KNOW? Your pet insurance company may be able to reimburse you the consultation fee

Step 5: Questionnaire

You will be required to complete and return a questionnaire regarding your dog at least a week before the consultation.
